## Parks and Recreation Reports:

- Ragbrai Announcement on January 24 $4^{\text {th }}$ - We are pleased to announce that Hiawatha will be an overnight stop during RAGBRAI 2015! The City Administrator, Kim Downs and Parks and Recreation Director, Kelly Friedl attended the RAGBRAI announcement on Saturday, January $24^{\text {th }}$ in Des Moines at the Iowa Events Center. Hiawatha will be the sixth stop of the week on Thursday, July 23 rd. Riders will be coming in from Cedar Falls where we will be welcoming over 15,000 riders into our community. RAGBRAI has not been in Hiawatha since 2004, so we are extremely excited for this opportunity to show visitors what Hiawatha is all about and the great amenities we have to offer. We will be forming committees and soliciting volunteers in the mean time and will post all updates on the City website and social media pages.
- Branching Out Grant- Alliant Energy and Trees Forever have granted Hiawatha a $\$ 7,645.00$ tree project grant through their Branching Out program. We will plant trees in Tucker and Clark Park as well as along Center Point Road during the spring/summer of 2015. We have received this grant for many years and are very grateful for the funds we have received to beautify our community.
- Cork n Canvas - There are two additional Cork and Canvas classes scheduled for 2015, March $12^{\text {th }}$ and November 19th with Amanda Happel of Cork N Canvas Iowa. March's painting will be of martini glasses.
- Kids Movie Night- Dolphin Tale 2 was shown at Kids Movie Night on January 9th. 25 parents and children enjoyed popcorn and juice and several won t-shirts! In March we will be showing Big Hero 6 for all to enjoy! Movies will also take place September 11th and November 13 ${ }^{\text {th }}$.
- Live Healthy Iowa - Live Healthy Iowa kicked off January $26^{\text {th }} .22$ City of Hiawatha Employees joined the wellness challenge and pledged to be more active in 2015. Several hours have already been logged by employees. Hiawatha is also going to host the Live Healthy Iowa 5k and Kids 1 K on April 11 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ in Guthridge Park. KHAK's Brain and Courtlin will also be in attendance. Jeff Mullin will provide the timing and Running Wild is donating gift certificates. We will be contacting the Kernals and AirFX for additional donations.

- 2015 Activity Brochure- J\&A Printing, a Hiawatha based company, is producing our Activity Brochure this year! They will be in a high resolution glossy ink similar to the Hiawatha Insights finish. We've received the proof and should be receiving copies to distribute in the coming weeks. New opportunities included in the brochure are Cork N Canvas, Super Sitters, Salad Preparation Class, Disc Golf Clinic, Fall Festival, Parents Night Out and Letters from Santa.
- Parents Night Out- We are excited to host our first PARENTS NIGHT OUT on February 13 th from 5:30 to 8:30PM. We've planned Valentines Bingo and Minute to Win it! We'll also have crafts and Casey's Pizza!
- Super Sitters - We've partnered with Mercy Hospital to offer children in the area a babysitting class on March $24^{\text {th }}$. Children ages $11+$ will attend a 6 hour class in the Community Center where they will learn basic first aid, choking rescue, fire and police emergencies, the business of babysitting and understanding and caring for kids $0-10$ years of age. ## Additional Business:

## Emergency Shelter for Adventure Camp:

Kelly Friedl, Director of Parks and Recreation advised the commission that the department is in search of another shelter in case of bad weather for our Adventure Camp program. Hiawatha Elementary has always been the shelter but they will be closing for the summer to construct a new geothermal heating and cooling system and adding new windows to the building. Ambyr has been in contact with Hope United Methodist Church who is considering allowing the children there in inclement weather. Hope will have a meeting on February $26^{\text {th }}$ to determine the outcome.

## Alice Training:

Kim Downs, City Administrator, informed the commission that they will be asked to attend ALICE training in the near future. She added that Hiawatha staff will be attending the same training during "Stand Down Day" on March 11 ${ }^{\text {th }}$. Two police officers are trained to role play as an active shooter
and will instruct the attendees what to do in such situation. Kim stated that the training will likely take place in April of this year.
