Hiawatha Parks and Recreation Regular Meeting June 13, 2017

Deb Theis called the meeting to order at 6:08p.m. in the Hiawatha Council Chambers. Present: Dan Gogel, Deb Theis, Dawn Ewoldt Absent: Dan Wilkes and Brandon Lynch Employees: Kelly Willadsen, Parks and Recreation Director, Ambyr Young, Administrative Coordinator, Rick Wolfe, Park Maintenance, Kim Downs, City Administrator, Aime Wichtendahl, Council Member, Bill Bennett, Mayor. Guests: Dan Hoffman.

Motion by Dawn Ewoldt, second by Dan Gogel to approve the June 13, 2017 agenda as amended. Motion carried.

Motion by Dan Gogel, second by Dawn Ewoldt to approve the minutes of March 14, 2017. Motion carried.

Replacement Lawn Mower Bids: Kelly Willadsen, Director of Parks and Recreation advised that it is time again to replace the park mowers for FY18. The mowers are in the equipment reserve fund that rotates every three years. This is done to keep the equipment up to date so that they sell at a reasonable price and not have to put money into the equipment as it gets older.

The department is considering replacing the #360 Zero Turn Scag in FY18 for a new Zero Turn John Deer zTrak replacement. The department would like to place this mower on Craig's List for a minimum bid of \$5,500.00 with the funding going back into the equipment reserve. If the mower was traded, the department would only receive \$4,000.00. Dan Gogel, Parks and Recreation Commission Member, asked what would happen if the minimum bid was not met. Kim Downs, City Administrator, advised that the equipment is already on reserve to pay full price. Rick Wolfe, Park Maintenance, added that the last piece of equipment sold on Craigslist in nine hours.

The parks staff will also be replacing the 2009 Landpride Flex Mower (Batwing). This was kept on the reserve for an additional three years in FY15 and is now time to be replaced. We have had to start putting funds towards this piece of equipment over the last year. We will be trading this piece of equipment in for the value of \$5,500.00.

Three different bids were received from Rexco, P & K Midwest and Midway Outdoor Equipment for the Scag. Rexco, P&K Midwest and Kromminga submitted bids for the Landpride Batwing. Hiawatha staff chose P&K Midwest Inc. for both pieces of equipment, not only because they came in the lowest, but they will also be able to provide two new pieces of equipment on July 1st, give a replacement piece if maintenance will take longer than 24 hours and they are located here in Hiawatha.

The department would like to ask for your recommendation to place the current Scag on Craig's List accepting minimum bids of \$5,500.00 and approving P&K Midwest Inc. bid to purchase one new John Deer z Trak mower for 9,803.46 and one new Landpride Flex Mower (Batwing) for \$7,400.00 out of

reserve dollars. Your recommendation will go to the June 21st Council Meeting for approval.

Motion made by Dan Gogel, second by Dawn Ewoldt to recommend to council to place the current scag on Craigslist and approve the purchase of John Deere Z Trak mower for \$9,803.46 and the Landpride Flex Mower for \$7,400 out of reserve dollars. Motion carried.

Reports:

Hiawatha Little Mustangs Basketball Camp: Sixteen boys and girls ranging from kindergarten through 5th grade participated in our first Little Mustangs Basketball Camp. Coach Aaron Jennings focused on shooting, ball handling, footwork, passing, cutting and rebounding. Coach Jennings mentioned that the clinic went very well and he'd like to have it a couple times a year.

Soccer: About 120 parents and children are participating in this summer's Hiawatha Soccer program. Soccer is generously sponsored by First Federal Credit Union.

Yoga in the Park: Yoga in the Park will take place before the Farmers Market at 10am on the First Sunday of the month from July through September.

Hiawatha Farmers Market: Hiawatha Farmers Market has taken off without a problem. Vendors have turned out to like the layout and Dawn is doing a great job of managing it.

Adult Volleyball: This league is not for the faint of heart! Starting Wednesday, May 3^{rd} through June 28^{th} at 6:15 or 7:15pm adults will kick up some sand in Guthridge Park and ace, kill and dig some balls. Scott Bell is helping run this league this year.

Live Healthy Iowa Kids Track Meet: NEW! The Collaborated Track meet on May 20th in Cedar Rapids unfortunately got rained out. We will continue to partner next year with Cedar Rapids and Marion.

Memorial Day Weekend Kickoff: On May 26th we held our annual Kids Bike Rodeo and Parade out at Guthridge Park. We were fortunate to receive donated helmets again from the Iowa Association for Justice. We had nearly 60 kids in attendance throughout the event with the Hiawatha officers teaching information on hand signals and bike safety. We finished the event with a ride around the Guthridge Park trail lead by officer Allaire. After the rodeo, we had Copperhead Creek perform our first Concert in the Park from 6-9pm. We had close to 100 people in attendance.

Hiawatha Adventure Camp: Hiawatha Adventure Camp will begin on June 12th. We are excited to have a full camp of kids for this summer. We have a great staff this year with two returning counselors. They are ready to get started!

Fun Fest 2017: We will have a smaller fireworks show this year and they will be set off on city property rather than Waterhouse but we do have some new activities coming your way during Fun Fest 2017! Did I mention FREE! We will have a Trackless Train, National Guard Rock Wall and Euro Bungee Trampoline for the whole family to enjoy! Don't miss out, Fun Fest 2017, August 25-26th! If you can help volunteer we are looking for people to assist with the Euro Bungee and Kids Tractor Pull. We will have a smaller fireworks show this year and they will be set off on city property rather than Waterhouse.

Pinterest Party Cork n Craft: We had 12 people registered for our summer Cork and Craft program. On Tuesday, June 13th they designed three canvas pieces using geometric designs! We have been very impressed with the numbers for this program.

Tennis: Balls are flying during the Rookies lessons on Wednesdays from five to six on Guthridge's tennis courts. Three kids between the ages of seven to ten signed up to learn the fundamentals of tennis taught by Westfield Tennis Club's instructor, Riley. The next session (offered to ages between 4 and 400 for \$52) begins June 26. Sign up today!

Ride to Wrigley: June 2nd was a beautiful day for baseball and if you're a Chicago Cubs fan, it doesn't get any better than a win against the St. Louis Cardinals. Ambyr and Karlene, Marion Parks and Recreation, supervised a group of over fifty as they traveled by Windstar from Target on Blairsferry to Wrigley Field. Fans left at 5:30am and returned to Target a little after 11PM. Hiawatha Bank and Trust was gracious enough to sponsor this trip. Kelly and Ambyr are looking to expand the trip next year with two buses — one Hiawatha and one Marion — to either Wrigley or Busch Stadium for a change of pace.



Parks:

- Splash Pads are now turned on and in full use! After this year we will look at the water consumption and see if the change in hours had any effect.
- We will meet with Hiawatha Kids League on Tuesday, June 13th in regards to the solar panel they would like to install on the concession stand roof.
- We had two Eagle Scouts complete their projects on May 6th and May 13th. Chase Pasterski completed the retaining wall out at Guthridge Park with the help of City staff and his 20 volunteers. Cameron Kelso completed landscaping around the benches out at Clark Park. He planted some native plants and pollinators to attract the butterflies along with perennials that will keep maintenance minimal for staff. We thank them for their hard work and helping us continue to beautify our parks.
- On May 10th, Kelly met with Hiawatha Kids League and Linn County Public Health to go over their annual concession stand audit. Everything went smooth and they continue to keep the facility in great shape.
- The Cedar Rapids Disc Golf Group that puts on our April tournament purchased a memorial tree in May. On June 2nd City Staff planted a gingko tree in honor of Ian Connour an avid disco golf player to the Cedar Rapids Group. This tree separates the disc golf holes 3 and 4. This group is also helping us purchase new disc golf signage. Michael Deeter, has collected 18 sponsorships and is putting together a new design. The wooden signs we currently have are starting to show some wear and tear. We will order the signs from Prison Industries and keep the wooden signs on back up.
- Hiawatha is following the states recommendations in regards to the new fireworks law. Citizens are reminded that fireworks are not allowed to be shot off in our parks.

Approval for Kona Ice to attend August 13th pavilion rental: On Sunday, August 13th Cathy Muller, would like to have Kona Ice come to the Teal Pavilion at Clark Park for her daughter's fourth Birthday party. They will arrive at 11:30am and leave by noon. This will only be for her invited guests at her rental. Kona understands our City policy and we have never had issues with them.

Approval for HKL solar panel installation: The Hiawatha Kids League is seeking permission to install a green energy producing alternative; solar panels atop the Guthridge Park concession stand. These 2 or 3 solar panels (3.5' x 5.5') would offset the energy consumption and would produce the most solar power if mounted onto the roof section facing the south; this has 200 gross square feet of area or 75 square feet of viable set back square feet. The solar panels need to be in proximity to the concession stand meter.

The solar system would produce approximately 1160 watts or 1.16 KW (\$200) per year and the HKL energy consumption averages 5.5 KWH each season or (\$500). The offset would be captured with a bidirectional meter provided by Alliant Energy; the meter would spin in the opposite (favorable) direction when energy was being produced by the solar panels.

Moxie Solar from North Liberty, Iowa would conduct the installation with certified contractors and electricians. Total cost would be under \$4000, HKL intends to pay for the installation and maintenance of the solar system with City guidance. Hiawatha Kids League has earned a Green Communities grant for \$2500 and would pay for the balance of the installation with budgeted funds for special projects. Moxie Solar would initiate a contract with the City of Hiawatha and abide to all of the necessary codes and installation requirements for proper mechanical and electrical functionality. Desired installation would be

for the fall of 2017. Before install the City will need to remove the maple tree in front of the concession stand for safety purposes so that kids cannot climb on the roof moving forward. There will be a tree replanted after construction.

The Solar Panel would demonstrate to the youth and families of the league the benefits of green energy alternatives and how solar energy is converted into useful applications in the concession stand. The solar panels have a life span of over 20 years and would help HKL defray the cost and use of traditional energy for year to come.

Kelly, Kim Downs, Patrick Parsley (Community Development) and Mark Parmenter (City Attorney) met with Chris Richards who is heading up this project to discuss moving forward and making sure all permits and necessary guidelines are met by the Park and Rec and Community Development departments. Mark Parmenter will have an agreement draft for you at Tuesday night's meeting, that explains the partnership and what is expected of Hiawatha Kids League moving forward. Hiawatha Kids League will be responsible for maintaining the panels once they are placed on the facility. I am asking for a recommendation to council to move forward with the construction of this project. Hiawatha Kids League has done great things for our community. With your approval, this will go to City Council at the August 16^{th} meeting.

End of year report: Take a look at all the accomplishments during the last fiscal year July 2016 to June 2017.

Reports:

- Yoga in the Park: Yoga will take place again before the Farmers Market at 10am on the
 First Sunday of the month in August and September. We had a great turnout in July and
 hope to continue a strong following.
- Hiawatha Adventure Camp: Hiawatha Adventure Camp is on their last week of camp! We
 have had a successful year and can't thank our staff enough for all their hard work and
 dedication to the kids. We had a full camp this year with 50 kids in both sessions. We will be
 looking at price adjustments for 2018 to make sure all of our expenses are covered. Thank
 you to our Friends Foundation for assisting with program supplies and field trip expenses.
- Fun Fest 2017: August 25-26th, 2017. We need volunteers! Please gather your family and friends and donate a bit of our time to our community celebration! Koozies are going to be handed out at upcoming events to help market the occasion! We need help at the Kids Tractor Pull, Euro Bungee and kids activities. Let us know where you would like to help out!
- **Tennis:** Session two has wrapped up and the final session of the year is in full swing. Two tots are learning the basics on Wednesdays from 4 to 4:45pm.
- **Blastball:** Blastball was extended an extra week after the Iowa weather through the teams a bone crushing curve ball and cancelled several of their scrimmages. No pinch hitters here, these three to five-year old's were at bat and ready to hit their very first dingers. Blastball is brought to the community by World Class Industries.

- Movies under the Moon: July 21st movie in the park was cancelled due to the crazy summer weather. We were unable to reschedule due to the equipment rental but will be ready for our next movie showing August 25th!
- **Kids Movie Night:** You know it's fall when Kids Movie Nights are back in the Community Center! Our first one of the season will take place September 8th at 6:30pm. The movie is yet to be determined.
- **Weekday Farmers Market:** We have chosen to cancel the weekday Farmers Market this year due to a long Hiawatha Kids League season and road construction in front of City Hall. We have made many changes to the Sunday market this year and will be waiting to see what location is best for the weekday market for 2018.
- HiBRAI: Join us for the 15th Annual Hiawatha Bike Ride Around Iowa (HiBRAI) August 19 20! This 55-mile, intermediate bike ride will take us from Hiawatha south for an overnight stay at Riverside Casino & Golf Resort. HiBRAI has received a special rate for this event of \$89.95 King or Double (usually \$169.95)!!!Don't miss out on this fun-filled charity ride to benefit the Friends of Hiawatha Parks and Recreation, a non-profit organization that supports children's programs and park updates offered by the Hiawatha Parks and Recreation Department. Fully stocked rest stops will be frequent along this scenic route with snacks and lunches provided by many local sponsors and poolside happy hour upon arrival at the casino. The registration fee is \$45/person, late registration is \$60 after August 5th.
- Music in the Park: Bring your coolers and lawn chairs and enjoy the evening with family and friends at Hiawatha's Music in the Park! Concerts are from 6-9 and held at Guthridge Park. Concerts are sponsored by University of Iowa Community Credit Union.
- Touch a Truck: August 4th from 4pm to 6pm in the Guthridge Park parking lot. This community event provides families with the opportunity to learn about and explore trucks, construction vehicles, and public safety equipment that they know and love! Kids of all ages will climb, run around, sit in and even honk horns of many types of trucks and vehicles! Please bring a nonperishable food donation to help support HACAP!
- NFL Punt Pass Kick: The NFL Punt, Pass, & Kick program is a national skills competition for boys and girls between the ages of 6 and 15 to compete separately against their peers. Girls and Boys in five spate age divisions (6-7, 8-9, 10-11, 12-13, and 14-15) compete against each other in punting, passing and place kicking in a fun and engaging forum. 
