Investigator Rod Fiser Receives Award

On April 9, 2014, United States Attorney Kevin W. Techau presented Hiawatha Police Investigator Rod Fiser and Division of Criminal Investigation Special Agent Darrell Simmons the Law Enforcement Victim Service Award. The award is the highest federal honor in the State of Iowa for victim services provided by law enforcement. Investigator Fiser and Special Agent Simmons received The Single Act Award for their work investigating the death of 17 month-old Kamryn Schlitter.

Investigator Fiser and Special Agent Simmons combined their efforts to ensure that those responsible for her death were identified, charged and convicted. During their investigation, they never lost sight of the impact this crime had on Kamryn's grieving family. "This team met with Kamryn's family members and navigated the tender balance between consoling griefstricken loved ones and gathering the factual information they needed to uncover the truth about what happened to Kamryn," said U.S. Attorney Techau.

Investigator Fiser has worked for the Hiawatha Police Department for more than 20 years.

Hiawatha Police Install Drug Drop Box

The Hiawatha Police Department is now accepting expired, unused, or unwanted medicines 24 hours a day with the addition of a drug drop box. The drop box is located inside the front door to the Police Department, on the Interstate side of the City Hall building.

The drop box provides a safe disposal method for both prescription and over-the-counter medicines. We do ask that needles, sharps, and syringes not be deposited in this container.

Drug drop boxes prevent medications from getting into our water supply, youths from accessing and abusing prescription drugs, and also prevent accidental and intentional poisonings in the home. We have joined all Linn County Law Enforcement Agencies in making safe disposal a priority within our communities.

Library Charrette and Feasibility Study

The Hiawatha Public Library has taken another step in realizing the excitement of a remodeled, expanded library for our community. In March several citizens and staff participated in a design charrette to determine the needs of our patrons as we consider a future expansion of our current library facility. Architects from FEH Associates were available to sketch the ideas shared by those in attendance. A design of the exterior and interior was formulated along with a favorable floor plan matching the needs of our present and future patrons.

The Library has used a donation to hire local fundraiser ME&V to determine the feasibility of a capital campaign to raise money for this project. The feasibility study committee is comprised of seven volunteers who will meet for the next few months to identify potential donors and volunteer leaders in the community. This capital campaign has not started, but the Library is hoping to determine the likelihood of a successful capital campaign. This study will assess how much money can most likely be raised, outline the most effective fundraising strategy, assess readiness for a campaign, and recommend a realistic and appropriate campaign goal.


Introducing Hiawatha's Newest Team Members

Mosquito Control Program 2014


The City of Hiawatha has awarded the 2014 Mosquito Control Program to Mosquito Control of Iowa from Rolfe, Iowa.

The City will receive a combination of treatments from the Integrated Pest Management treatments through out the program season based on the NPDES permit. Depending on the weather and species of mosquitoes that are encountered, the treatments will be selected from the control methods to provide the City with the best results available.

Requested Spray Dates: Before Concerts in the Park, May 23, August 1, 8, 15 & 22 and before Hog Wild Days June 19 - 23.
