

#### **Groundbreaking Ceremony - Mercy Hiawatha Medical Park**

Mercy Medical Center broke ground on a new medical park located at 1195 Boyson Road in Hiawatha on Wednesday, August 5. Mercy's Hiawatha Medical Park will consist of three separate projects, including an outpatient surgery center located directly off Interstate 380.

Mercy will lease space from a local developer in what will be a three-story, 60,000 square foot building. The developer plans to add two stories to an existing single-story building, which was formerly occupied by Duffy's Collectible Cars.

The Medical Park will include three initial components:

The third floor of the building will be the site of Mercy's new outpatient surgery center.

The second floor will be leased by another tenant (currently in discussions with Wolfe Eye Clinic).

Discussions are underway to provide additional services on the building's first floor as an extension of clinic services.

The Medical Park is scheduled to open in spring 2016.







## Snowbirds and Vacationers

Snowbirds and vacationers should contact the Police Department to complete a house check form providing contact information while you are away. Our house check form is available on the city website, www.hiawatha-iowa.com, or at the police department during normal business hours, Monday - Friday from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM. Emergency contact, license plates of vehicles at the residence and other pertinent information is needed to complete the form. While you are away, officers can check the exterior of the residence to ensure all appears to be in order. This service is free and we encourage you to take advantage of the program. You can feel secure knowing your residence is being checked while you are away and the police department can provide additional security for you and your neighborhood.



#### Hiawatha Public Library Outreach Services

The Hiawatha Public Library has an important new partnership with the Hiawatha Care Center to provide outreach services to their residents. Selections from the Metro Library Network are delivered to the Hiawatha Care Center once a month. Residents are able to choose from a variety of media including large print books, audio books and DVDs.

Although this kind of service isn't new to to the Hiawatha Care Center, Activities Director Joni Oltmanns states that they are finding the outreach the Hiawatha Library provides much easier to use. She says, "It (the previous service) was a great service but it was difficult to keep up with because they sent things so rapidly and there was such a quick turnaround. Many of the residents had a difficult time finishing with the materials before they needed to be sent back." Now, if they need a change or a resident has a particular request, the Library is very close and can facilitate that change or fill that request easily.

One resident who uses the library outreach service is Elva Boyse. Elva, who will be 100 years old in October, has always been an avid reader and still enjoys reading on her Nook with a magnifying glass. With the exception of 28 years spent in Arizona, Elva has been a lifelong resident of Cedar Rapids. In addition to raising two children, Elva spent many years working at Quaker Oats. Elva says she "really enjoys John Grisham" and "prefers mysteries with very little romance." Because it is getting more difficult to read print, Elva prefers books on CD and enjoys the selections the library provides.

Dorothy Topf is another resident who uses the library outreach service. Her husband Phil coordinates requests with the library to make sure that Dorothy has materials to use; she especially enjoys Western books on CD. Dorothy was a nurse before becoming a stay-at-home mother to their five children and Phil was with Rockwell Collins for 41 years. Phil says that the materials the library provides help "keep Dorothy's mind active and ... stimulated."

It isn't just the residents of the Hiawatha Care Center who are enjoying the library outreach. Library Assistant Sandy Raley, who coordinates and delivers the materials also enjoys meeting the residents and getting to know them. Sandy says, "I enjoy bringing (the residents) something that will bring them enjoyment and help keep them mentally active."

#### FALL SMOKE DETECTOR CHECK



The Hiawatha Fire Department will conduct its annual fall smoke detector check. #### **Tree Trimming Season is Here Again!**

City Staff has noticed trees that overhang streets and sidewalks becoming an issue in our City neighborhoods. The City Code requires that trees be kept trimmed eight (8) feet above sidewalks and fifteen (15) feet above the street surface. It is much easier to trim branches when needed and before they are damaged by larger truck traffic, resulting in broken branches and injury to the tree.

Trimming maintenance is the responsibility of the property owner to perform. The City will send out notices to property owners when we receive complaints of low hanging branches. We would encourage property owners to be proactive and keep their trees trimmed. Below are some examples of trees that are in need of trimming as they hang lower than the Code allows.



# Lawn Mowing - Are you pointed in the Right Direction?

When you are moving along, make sure your mower is pointing in the right direction - toward the lawn at all times. Grass clippings decompose in a matter of days, adding nutrients your lawn needs, like nitrogen, phosphorus and potassium.



This good lawn care habit also keeps clippings out of our streets and storm drains, preventing eventual delivery to our streams, where they cause water quality problems.

In addition to polluting the water, grass clippings and leaves can block drains and cause flooding. Sweep or blow them back into your yard.
